
## **Online Registration**

The Ontario Curling Association (Curl ON) has been working hard over the summer to provide clubs reopening guidelines and resources. They are also providing clubs with signage packages for in-ice and lounge signs. In addition, they're working on a contact tracing app that clubs will be using to assist with contact tracing. The app is going into BETA testing on September 1, and we will have it ready to use in time for the curling season. The app will essentially attendance and store the information of who was at the club on any given day for 30 days in case the Health Unit needs the information for contact tracing purposes. After 30 days, the information will be deleted. The Cornhole competition generously donating a device for us to use at the club to run the app on. At this time, Curl ON competitions will not be running, but we will keep an eye on how the season progresses as they may consider running things in the new vear.
